

NEWS FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS: The vote on the following By-Law changes will be held May 5. The following changes to the By-Laws of the Aeroguidance Society, Inc.

The following changes to the By-Laws of the Aeroguidance Society, In are being proposed to the general membership by the board of directors. A reason for the proposal will be given after each item.

* Addition to Article Seven
An audit of the club's financial records shall be conducted by
an audit team consisting of the President, Vice President and
Secretary, and shall be completed each year before the annual
meeting.

Reason - Club books have not been audited for over two years and it is felt that no new treasurer should be asked to assume his duties without an audit.

* Change to Article Four, Section 3
Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Fridays of each month.

Reason - A change from every other Friday is necessary to prevent meeting place scheduling problems, and to provide a more definite meeting schedule.

* Change to Article Seven, Section 2
Delete "Beginners Committee" from the list of permanent committees.

Reason - There should be no need for a beginners committee since the beginner's needs should be served during the regular meetings. Also, ther has been no active beginners committee for the past two years.

* Delete Article Seven, Section 4

Reason - The definition of beginners committee is not required if deleted from the list of permanent committees.

Change to Article Six, Section 1
The Board of Directors shall consist of seven members
(President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Past President, and two elected members at large) and have control and management of the affairs and business of the organization. The two members at large will be elected on alternate years at the annual meeting, for two year terms. Such Board of Directors shall only act in the name of the organization when it shall be regularly convened by its chairman after due notice to all of the directors of such meeting.

Reason - An expansion of the Board of Directors is felt desirable to provide greater capability to transact more club business outside of regular club meetings.

* Change to Article Five, Section 3
Voting privileges are extended to members in accordance with
New York State Law.

Reason - A change from twenty one years of age is proposed to stay in line with state law.

* Change to Article Nine, Section 4
Special assessments will only be levied on those members
21 years or older.

Reason - To change By-Laws in accordance with current practice.

* New Article Twelve
Dissolution of the Organization
Section 1
Dissolution of the club can be accomplished at any regular
or special meeting of the membership provided the members all
have been notified of the reason for dissolution in writing
at least seven days in advance of that meeting. Dissolution
shall be by a positive vote of three-fourths of the
attendees at that meeting called for that purpose.

Section 2 Upon dissolution, the club assets will be donated to The Academy of Model Aeronautics.
