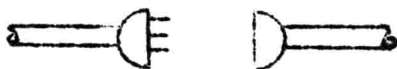

October is a big month for us, the club contest is on the 7th and the picnic is on the 8th. These are for the enjoyment of our members, so come out and enjoy yourselves.

INTRA CLUB CONTEST: Lou Francavillo

The AGS annual Intra Club Contest will be held at the club field on October 7 (rain date October 14). All club members are invited to participate. This is an opportunity for new members to get an idea of what contest flying is all about. For the members that are involved in contest flying, it is an opportunity to get in some late season practice. There will be three classes flown. Novice class will be open to members who have never flown in Class A, or have flown in the novice Intra club event and did not win.

Intermediate class is open to members that have flown class A or have won in the novice class in a previous Intra club contest.

Expert class is open to members having flown in Class B, C novice and C expert in AMA contests.

All maneuvers will be performed as described in the AFA rule book. The following maneuvers will be flown:

Novice Class

1. Straight flight out
2. Procedure turn
3. Straight return flight
4. Figure eight
5. One roll (axial or barrel)
6. Immelman
7. Stall turn
9. Landing perfection
10. Spot landing

Note - take off will not be judged, hand launch allowed.

Intermediate Class

1. Take off
2. Touch and go
3. Three rolls
4. Three loops
5. Three turn spin
6. Cuban eight
7. Straight inverted flight
8. Traffic pattern
9. Landing perfection
10. Spot landing

Expert Class

1. Take off
2. Touch and go
3. Three rolls
4. Four point roll
5. Figure M
6. Horizontal eight
7. Double immelman
8. Three outside loops
9. Reverse cuban eight
10. Slow roll
11. Landing perfection
12. Spot landing

Flying will start promptly at 10 am. Please plan to be at the field at 9 am so that you may register and have your plane ready to go in time. I could also use some help in preparing for the contest. PLEASE REMEMBER THIS IS A FUN EVENT
