


THE PREZ SEZ: Bob Noll



AL ROHNER, RUSS MANRICK, FILL UNDERKOFLER - finance committee.


As tressurer, Al Bohner will be the chairmon of this committee who will be in charge of formulating a financial plan for 1979 and periodically reporting our progress against this plan to

RAIN IS CAUSED BY HIGH PRESSURE AREAS, COLD FRONTS, WARM MOIST AIR AND WEEK ENDS!





BEGINNER CLASS


1st - Tem Temasky 354 points


We've been having some great weather up at the field the past few weekends. Let's hope for a few more befor we have to get the ski-planes out.


