Joe has had the experience of being Connector editor in 1984, so its not like he's new at the job. I'm sure that Joe will delight us with his editorial format.





We of IMAA are particularily pleased with the actions taken by your company, since the Morrisey Bravo aircraft, being a 1/4 scale, is one very likely to have been purchased, constructed, and flown by some of our members. The recall enhances the probability that the aircraft will be safe to fly once repairs are made, all to the benefit of all concerned.

IMAA sincerely appreciates the integrity and honesty of Sig Mfg. Company in issuing the "recall" and in continuing to conduct tests of its products after initial manufacture. You are to be commended! We are in the hopes that all manufacturers of aeromodelling products take the initiative and follow the course set by Sig Mfg. Co. Quality and safety should be the prime concern of everyone.


The nice weather also brought a few wives, girlfriends, and spectators.






