New Impound Rack in Use - In case you haven't noticed, there is a new impound rack at the field. Thanks to Bob Jennings, our tireless field chairman, the rack is of the all weather type and can accommodate 18 transmitters. Most transmitters will fit on all shelves except those single stick variety which need to use the top shelf. It is located at a very convenient place, directly under the flight board so that it will be used at all flying sessions. Please extend your appreciation to Bob for yet another important improvement to our field.

New Club Treasurer - The resignation of Grover Ellis was accepted and Bill Underkofler was voted in as the new Treasurer by the Board of Directors. The Board extended its appreciation for the many years of service by Grover who has been our Treasurer since 1982. Please join me in welcoming Bill to the Board. Bill is an experienced Treasurer having held the office several times in the past.

33rd Annual Pattern Contest - This is the month that the AGS features its major activity of the year. On June 24, 25, and 26, we will be hosting some of the greatest pattern flyers in the Northeast U.S. and Canada for a weekend of major competition in the sport of R/C Aerobatics. All members are expected to assist in the contest and there are plenty of jobs to go around. If you have not been contacted about a job, don't hesitate to call Tom Kopl our Contest Manager or myself. Neither Tom or I want anyone to be there with nothing to do.

This year we are allowing club members to enter the competition in any class. We previously allowed club members in the Novice category only. This change has been made to allow AGS members to compete for the NSRCA Top Gun Awards which will be presented by the National Society of Radio Controlled Aerobatics District I. So here's your chance AGS members to enter a major competition without having to travel a few hundred miles. Oh by the way, those members who do compete will be expected to hold down a major job at the contest as well. The three Contest Directors, Jim McKeown, Terry Terroniore and myself will not be competing in order that we may devote our total attention to the operation of the contest and uphold our tradition of one of the finest contests in the East.

See you at the Blue Swan Airport, June 24, 25 and 26.

Members in The Winners Circle - Six AGS members competed in the Thundervolts R/C Pattern Contest at Saratoga Springs over the Memorial Day weekend. The big winner was Wynn Aker who took home first place in Sportsman. Dick Fish was right on his heels for a solid second place and Terry Terronoire Sr. finished in fourth after holding on to first place throughout the first day. Congratulations!

Club Shirts & Patches - Don't forget to get your club shirt and wear it to the contest in Sayre. The shirt is a light blue dress shirt, either short or long sleeves, and can be purchased in all men's stores. Patches are available at GJ's or from Frank Gioffredo and should be placed so that the top of the patch is about 5 inches below the base of the collar. If you're interested in a club jacket, get a dark blue "coaches jacket" and put a patch on the back.

Sound Level Proposal - As most of you are aware there is a considerable amount of attention being paid to sound control by the AMA and many clubs. The AMA has recommended a limit of 90 db at 9 ft. and recently a club in Florida enacted a club rule that limits flying at their field to that maximum.

Since there are many new homes and more being built in the vicinity of the AGS field it is important that we begin a program for reducing the sound level at our field as soon as possible. Our knowledge of sound reduction techniques has grown significantly over the past year since we began taking sound measurements in 1987. We now have a significant amount of data and are in a good position to implement a sound reduction program.

The board of Directors has received a recommendation from our Sound Chairman, Ralph Jackson, regarding sound limits. The recommendation, which is supported by the Board, suggests a goal of 95 db maximum when measured at 9 ft. While Ralph did not recommend a maximum allowable limit, the Board feels that such an absolute limit should be implemented at some time in the future. However, the Board could not agree on what that limit should be but only that it should be implemented by October 1 of this year.

Our approach to implementing a sound reduction program will be to discuss the subject at the June meeting and then establish a program by vote of the general membership at the July meeting. To do this, I have asked Ralph to present his data and answer questions at the June meeting. I would also like to know your thoughts regarding the goal and the absolute limit at that meeting. Then at the July meeting we will act on a plan based on your input and recommendations.

So please give this very important subject your attention and contribute to the determination of the approach that you want your club to take toward a sound reduction program.

### \*\*\* Spring Float-Fly \*\*\*

On Sunday, 5-22-88 we had our first spring float-fly at Greenwood Park. To say the flying turnout was disappointing would be an understatement. Only 3 club members were there with planes and Danny and and Steve Luchako from came from Sayre. We did have a good turn out of spectators, 25 or 30. There was also one park patron who expressed interest in the club and asked about our next meeting. We did consume most of the food and I bought what was left over so we broke even, and had a good time. My plane was damaged on landing when I hit some floating debris and one other plane suffered an in flight wing failure at about 100 feet. Greenwood must have hard water because the fuze, wing, and floats that hit at full bore were badly damaged. The plane was an ARF Royal kit and a post-mortem showed that the wing joining spar had almost no glue on it. Since this piece of wood was virtually the only thing holding the wing halves together it is a wonder the wing did not fail on it's first flight.

The next Greenwood Float fly is scheduled to be a two day event Sept 17th and 18th. Since this will be our first 2 day event I hope some of the people who voted to have it are going to be willing to work to make it successful. Last year we had some prizes from a few manufacturers and we should do the same this year. If any one has any suggestions of some fun-type informal events we can start a little competition. We could offer some awards for such things as best finish, best scale, flyers choice, etc. What are your ideas? What do you want the event to be and what do you want it to become? I will work to make it whatever you want it to be.



Blue Swan Airport will be available for practice flying on Friday afternoon starting at 3 PM.


Contest registration will begin on Friday evening so we can get a head start setting up our flight lines. We are planning 3 lines this year to maximize flights.
