

A.M.A. INSURANCE.

If you haven't read the article about your A.M.A. insurance in the January issue of Model Aviation, you should. It is the A.M.A.'s response to the S.F.A.'s article published by RC Modeler in their December 94 issue. Prompted by the A.M.A.'s response (article), I put in a call to the A.M.A. to get some clarification on our coverage as site owners. To the best of my ability I understand it to be briefly as follows.

- For individual coverage, If you have home owners insurance coverage, A.M.A. insurance is the secondary coverage, if you do not have home owners coverage, A.M.A. becomes the primary coverage after you show proof of no home owners coverage.
- for property damage liability A.M.A. has a \$250 dollar deductible and then is liable (covers) up to 250,000 dollars per occurrence. Over 250K the Third Party Administrator (TPA) i.e., Royal Surplus Lines Insurance Company covers up to 2.5 million per occurrence after the A.M.A.'s 250K cap per occurrence.
- for bodily injury, there is no deductible. Thus, A.M.A. covers from the 1st dollar up to 250K and Royal (TPA) takes over after that up to 2.5 million.

So, for club or individual coverage, the A.M.A. is secondary coverage, and for Site Owner (again the AGS) they are primary coverage.

If you think I really understand this stuff, I do not. I only present it to you for awareness and information purposes. I hope I have not confused you. If you have any specific questions about coverage you should call the A.M.A. at 1-317-287-1256 and they should be able to answer them.

A.M.A. Membership.
