

MOWING THE A.G.S. FIELD.

In case you don't know, I have lent the A.G.S. a hand push mower this season for use around the pavilion and other places where you cannot get the tractor gang mower. My mower is a Sears Eager-1 and is stored in the tractor shed. It is equipped with a four-cycle motor so it runs on straight gas. Before starting the mower, please check the oil. I left a quart of 10W30 oil with the mower in case you need to add a bit. If you add oil, please be careful not to over fill the crank case. To check the oil, press down on the oil cap and turn it counter-clockwise, remove the oil dip stick, wipe it clean, and reinsert into the oil passage, then remove the dip stick to read the oil level. Only add oil if the level is below the add-1 quart line on the dip stick.

To start the mower, set the control lever to the Hi position. This is a lever located on the "top-side" of the mower and is labeled Hi, Lo and Stop. It can be turned to the left and back (the Stop position). Press the prime button two or three times. set your left foot on the deck where it is labeled to do so, and pull the pull-cord straight up quickly. If the mower doesn't start, re-prime (press the black button two or three times). Set your foot on the deck, and pull again. It should start with two to three tries. The blade is newly sharpened, and the spark plug is new. From time to time the wheel shafts need a couple of drops of oil.

#### PROGRAM FOR THE JULY 18th MEETING AT THE FIELD.

Elsewhere in this issue you will find the program announcement; sound or noise abatement techniques. As an aid to the clubs efforts to comply with our noise limit requirement (98dbs or less at 9 feet), and our effort to collect noise data; bring a plane (the one you fly the most; or one that you suspect has a high noise level) to the meeting, so we can take noise readings and make recommendations accordingly. Data collection is very useful as you can refer to the data to see which set-ups are good (comply) and not so good.

#### PAINTING CREW CHIEF NEEDED.

At the last club meeting I announced that the tractor shed needed some attention. It needs paint in several places where it has weathered. If you were in attendance, you heard me ask for a crew chief to head-up the paint detail. The silence was deafening! And you guessed it, my phone is not ringing off the hook! Is there not at least one; I repeat ONE... club member that feels compelled to make a contribution to the club of some of his time to raise a crew, and do a bit of painting?. I would guess that 4 or 5 guys could paint the whole tractor shed is a couple of hours or less. How about it?
