#### Vice President's Report:

Scott talked to the proprietors of G.J.'s Hobbies and received permission to move the club library to their store.

### Old Business

It was reported that there has been damage to the road leading up to the AGS field, due to construction at the property which used to be owned by Mrs. Allen. Apparently, the damage is more significant than the damage that was reported at the last meeting. Terry volunteered to speak to the new owner about this matter to attempt to arrive at a resolution.

### New Business

The club cabinet which contains the library materials will be moved to G.J.'s Hobbies.

The club is still in need of a librarian. If you can fill this post, please see Terry Terrenoire.

Monthly Show-n-Tell raffle. The AGS board had decided to eliminate this monthly raffle in order to save money. Art Riegel opened discussion on this issue, and stated that the raffle should be reinstated because it encouraged members to bring in items to show. After further discussion, a vote was held, and the vote was 16 – 5 in favor of reinstating the raffle. The Show-n-Tell raffle will begin again in February.

It was also proposed that the club start a monthly 50/50 raffle to generate extra revenue. This will begin in February.

Terry Terrenoire and Paul Cushing successfully changed banks for our savings and checking accounts. We will receive free checking, and our Money Market account is now paying 2.5%. A minimum balance of \$5000 is required.

As has been discussed in the past, the club is in need of a new flail mower, since our current mower is not working well, and attempts to repair it have not been entirely successful. It was estimated that a new flail mower would cost between \$2500 and \$3000. This is more than the club can afford to pay in the near future, and the money may need to be raised via a special assessment on the membership.

## Newbie's Corner

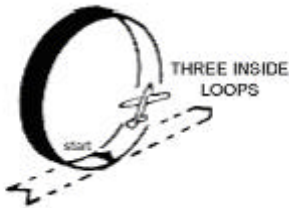

This month we will start with actual maneuvers. This is three simple loops (Simple? Try this sometime and keep your plane on line, it isn't simple). Below is the Aresti view of various loops. For real newbies, one loop is challenging enough, try entering and exiting on exactly the same altitude and heading.

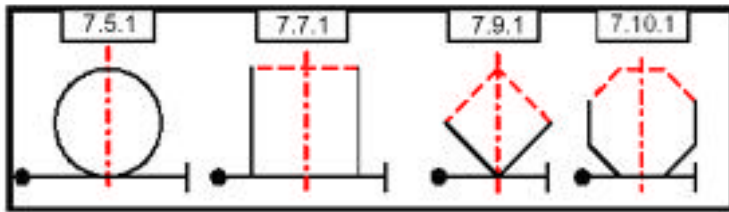
**Inside Loops** (any number). Model pulls up and executes prescribed number of consecutive loops; all loops shall be round and superimposed.

Downgrades:

1. Loops not round.
2. Loops not superimposed.
3. Wings not level during loops.
4. Changes in heading during loops.
5. Exit not same altitude and heading as entry.



A complete loop shall have its center point as the center of the maneuver

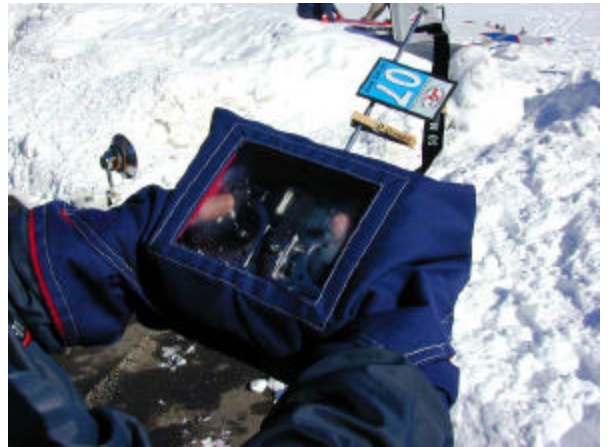
