AEROBATIC PRIMER 2007

AGS AIRPORT May 26, 2007 10:00: Instruction 12:00 Lunch 12:30 Flying

Most importantly the Aerobatic Primer for 2007 has been RESCHEDULED! Due to the very snowy and rainy spring we have not been ale to properly prepare the AGS R/C airport for spring flying much less than an aerobatic contest sanctioned by AMA. I called AMA and had them reissue our sanction for the last Saturday in May, the 26th. This will give us enough time to let the runways dry out and the parking area and the road to be prepared as well.

The day will start at 10:00 with morning instruction and "dry flying of the maneuvers." Several aerobatic pilots will be on hand led by Bob Noll. We will have lunch about Noon and the flying will start shortly there after.

Now to the good part, the flying! AMA has issued a completely new set of maneuvers for 2007. This is true for all four of the AMA classes, Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced, and Masters. The best way to get information about the new sequences is to go to the National Society Radio Control Aerobatics' (NSRCA) website, <u>www.nsrca.org</u>. On the home page's left margin there is a title, "Judging Rules" click on it. On the next page in the center, near the bottom will be four links, one for each of the AMA competition classes. Click on your sequence and you will get a wonderful description of each maneuver for each class.

One major change for the 2007 season is that take offs and landings are now judged maneuvers. For the last several years take offs and landings were either 10 or 0. This year there will be down grades for a variety of reasons, as it had been in the past. Check the website for this information. Another significant development for 2007 is the "progressive" sequencing. Each level prepares you for the next higher level. For example, there is a 45 degree down line in all four sequences. In Sportsman it is just that 45 down. Intermediate it is 45 down with a ½ roll; Advanced has it with a snap and Masters has it with a snap and a half.

Lastly let me say I hope every member of the AGS comes to the primer. If you currently compete in AMA sanctioned contests as Advanced, Masters, or FAI come as a judge and helper. Everyone else should come and fly. Bring your favorite airplane, the one you like to fly most often and the one you fly the best. I guarantee you will finish the day a better pilot. You may not come in first place, but you will be a better pilot. We all fly STRAIGHT and LEVEL, or so we think. That is the second maneuver in the Sportsman Sequence, right after TAKE OFF. Flying truly STRAIGHT and LEVEL takes a lot of skill. Come to the contest you will leave a better pilot. OH! Did I mention free food? Actually, it is not free, it is included in the entry fee of \$15.00.

World Models Zen 30 Aerobatics ARF; \$139 Powered by a O.S. LA engine. Using BB servos. Weighs 4 lbs 4 oz.

Matt Struck:

Evelox, indoor, full fuselage, foam plane. Carbon fiber rods make it stiff. Powered by a Rimfire motor. Uses eFlite F60 servos, a Jeti ESC and LiPo battery pack. A magnetic hatch is on the underside to hold the electronics. Flies nicely. Weighs 7.8 oz RTF.

Matt Struck:

Spektrum DX7 spread spectrum radio. Two receivers in one. The antennas are positioned at 90 degrees to each other. It has model matching to prevent the user from flying a plane using the wrong radio set up. Futaba is supposed to have a SS system soon.

Bob Noll:

E-flite Byp Yak 3D ARF designed by Quique Somenzini. It is a foam biplane. Bob made two short flights at the gym. The electronics were moved from his Flatana.
