## Did You Know – Submitted by Bob Noll

Here's a look back at a few items from The Connector from March 1971, fifty years ago.

Dick Allen was our president and I was the newsletter editor.

THE PREZ SEZ – Dick Allen

Here it is, the middle of the "building season" – emphasized anew by the descent of another 23 inches of the white stuff. Ambitious projects abound (folding wings, retracting gear, sliding canopies, sleek racers, etc.) promising an interesting flying season ahead. That's great, and in order to shorten the time in which some of today's beginners can tackle equally challenging projects, we've initiated a program whereby experienced volunteers (yesterday's beginners) can help the newcomer.

The intent is to provide help on a person-to-person basis; something AGS members have traditionally done. The real difference is how the beginner will know who is willing to help and in what areas. The 1971 Club Roster – to be published soon – will provide the key to the program.

FOR BEST RESULTS – DON'T WAIT TOO LONG – Bob Noll

This is the conclusion that the editor reached as the result of an experiment that he ran using 3M 77 spray adhesive. Having heard problems experienced by a few club members who used the 3M adhesive for foam wings, I decided to conduct my own test. To make a long story short, the experiment revealed that the "open time" between when the sheeting and foam are sprayed with the adhesive is very critical. "Open Time" is the time between when the sheeting and foam are sprayed and when the two surfaces are joined. Samples prepared at 5, 10, 15, 20, 30 and 45 minutes "open time" were tested by pulling 1/16" x 1" balsa strips from a foam block. Excellent bonds were obtained for the 5, 10 and 15 minute samples while the other samples failed without and fracture to the wood or foam.

## Show & Tell –

Scott Wallace's Sig Scamp 3 channel with an OS 20 & JR XG11 radio. Silk span and dope finish.





Scott Wallace's Ace RC Bingo 40 with a Saito 56 & JR XG11 radio. Silk and dope finish with a two-part rattle can clear urethane top-coat.



### Paint Experiment – by Todd Kopl

Unlike the beautiful silk covering and paint on Scott's projects I have primarily utilized Monokote for covering my projects over the years. I won't say I have mastered this method but I am generally satisfied with the results, ease of repair if needed, and long life. However, in recent years Monokote matching paint from hobby outlets has vanished. At one time Hobbyoxy had a large assortment of matching colors (required mixing and spray equipment) but yielded excellent results. Top Flite LustreKote was also a popular rattle can option that no longer exists. So, what happens when you need to paint a cowl or wheel pants to match your iron on covering? I created some samples and set off to Auto Finishers in Vestal for color scan paint match but after finding out the expense (nearly \$50 for a can of color & the required can of clear) I decided to try other options. How hard could it be to find a close match from a \$5

rattle can? Turns out harder than you think. The small Tamiya can (obtained from Small Addictions) is a beautiful product, probably best paint I have ever seen come out of a can but it did not match. My son Sam actually spotted the Krylon can and in person it is nearly a perfect match for Monokote Insignia Blue. The only catch is the satin finish and requires a clear coat for gloss match. Dad had given me some old cans of LustreKote for the other colors I need but turns out those cans while full no longer work. So, my new conclusion is I will go back to Auto Finishers, pay the price for exact color match, and you will probably be seeing the same colors on my models for years to come!
