I got that tightened up and did a checkout flight the following week, and still had fluttering issues. Another elevator hinge broken. Got that fixed up, and tried it out again. Things seemed good, so I pushed it a bit harder, more fluttering that I

didn't recover from, and put it into a tree North of the field. After finding it well up in altitude, Greg and I went over with most of the poles used for the pylon flags, and after much struggle, got it down. I've ordered a new tail section and motor. It should be ready next week.

**AGS General Membership Meeting – Dave
Dewey-Wright (covering for Jesse Pagels)**

The AGS Meeting was held on 6/7/2021 at the AGS Field. The meeting was called to order at 6:45 with 11 members physically present and 1 connected by Zoom.

1. The minutes of the previous General meeting were approved.
2. The minutes of the previous Board of Directors (BOD) meeting were presented from memory by Jeff Hatton, which had been held on-line on May 27th.
3. Treasurer's report
 - Bob Jennings presented the current balance of the club account. From the expected income, we are currently short a few members' dues, but we have had a couple new members join.

- There was also a contribution of gas toward the field expenses.
- A discussion of late payments was had, including possible options of automatically dropping members from the roles, or penalties being assessed.
 - And/or publish a list of delinquent members on the web-site
4. Jeff Hatton brought up a new board item – he was contacted by someone from Double-Aught Lumber regarding taking timber from our land. The general consensus was that where the timber is taken, the land needs to be left in “useable” condition, treetops can't be left littered around. The BOD will continue this discussion.
 5. The proposed changes to the By Laws, regarding adding the definition of a “Minor Quorum” and “Major Quorum” came up at this point.
 - The text changes were read aloud. During the reading a grammatical error in article IV, section E. was found. The suggestion was made to change, “or elect board members.” to, “or election of board members.” A motion was made by Jerry Wright to make the text change, seconded by Todd Kopl. The motion was approved.
 - A motion to approve the changes to the By Laws as amended was made by Jerry Wright, and seconded by Todd Kopl. The motion was approved.
 6. As part of the changes made to the By Laws, it was requested that the Secretary send out an e-mail question of, “Why don't you attend club meetings?” When this comes around, please do NOT do a “reply all”, just a simple reply to the secretary.
 7. The proposed change to the field rules regarding pets and leashes was brought forth. As part of that discussion, a second proposed wording was brought forward. A motion to go with the new wording was made by Bob Noll, and seconded by Jerry Wright. It was approved. A motion to accept the updated Field Rule change to include the leash/pet rule was made by Jeff Hatton and seconded by Jerry Wright. The motion passed with one abstention.
 8. The Spring Float Fly at Cole park had been well attended. Bob Noll had the only plane there flying with an I.C. Engine.
 9. A request was made that the mowing schedule be published at least 6 weeks ahead to make sure no one is caught unaware and can make calls for substitutions if needed.
 10. Apparently, the AMA web-site was not showing the AGS club. I believe some calls were made and this has been corrected.
 11. Upcoming Events -
 - Pattern Contest – 8/14-15
 - VRCS – 9/4-5
 - Float Fly – 9/25-26
 12. With things opening up more, it is hoped there will be better attendance at the Pattern Contest, which will include the Club class and Sportsman's class.
 13. Planning to restart the Learn to Fly program and have Open House at the field on Tuesday nights, in July and August.
 14. Ray Phillips ordered some AGS decals from Callie Graphics. The price for them is \$2 for the small ones and \$4 for the large ones. Jesse will have them. The club authorized payment to Ray for the cost of the decals.
 15. The club also authorized payment to Bob Noll of \$9 for the 50 club brochures he had printed.
 16. Show & Tell:
 - Bob N. - a short talk on balancing your plane, including a handout sheet to help determine the Mean Aerodynamic chord.
 - His observation is that too many are flying with tail heavy planes.
 - Using the info on the sheet should at least get the plane flyable.
 - Todd K. showed us his latest build of a SIG Kavalier kit. After which there was a general discussion of SIG kits.
 17. Motion to end the meeting by Dave D-W at 8:52.

Pylon Racing – Submitted by Matt & Todd Kopl

After the rainout of race #1 we successfully completed races 2 & 3 on June 9th & 23rd respectively with tremendous club turnout for both evenings. Lots of close racing and knock-on-wood we all still have planes in one piece! There was some debate on Matt's win over his Dad during race #3 (Matt w/ 2 cuts, Dad with 0 cuts) but the results are reported as recorded from race officials.

Jesse Pagels joined us for race #3 (his 1st race ever!) and did a phenomenal job finishing every heat w/out incident. I asked him for a short description of his experience:

"So, I finally got to fly in my first pylon race and it seemed that I was plagued with setbacks. I crashed my first racer last October due to a flameout (and inexperience), and labored to rebuild the fuse that ended up in three pieces. As the season began, weather stopped our first race and work sent me out of town for the second one. But, the third time's the charm and before I knew it, I was hurriedly fueling up my Lanier Predator 500 and heading out to the starting line.

I'll admit, I was a bit nervous, but I had a good half dozen flights on my racer since the crash and just told myself that all I had to do was two things: fly fast and turn left. If only racing was so simple. In my first race I was all over the place, but I didn't cut and I put in my ten laps. I had a rougher landing than I had practiced for but my plane was in one piece and was ready for another heat.

As I flew in further heats, I found that my nerves had calmed and my flying was becoming more regular. I was focusing on flying straight and pulling hard into the turns and before I knew it, all of the races were finished and it was time to dig into hotdogs and soda (Many thanks to Brent for being the grill master that he is). While I didn't win any heats and was easily the slowest flying that day, I didn't crash and my racer was ready to fly another day. In a way, I felt that I had won in my own right as I had surpassed my own expectations and had an exhilarating race day." Jesse

Please remember, although you will see many of us flying racers powered by glow fuel electric propulsion is also acceptable. If anyone is interested in racing but has been hesitant for whatever reason please contact me.

Did You Know – Submitted by Bob Noll

Here are few things that were being reported fifty years ago in the June 1971 Connector;

THE VICE-PREZ SEZ – Bob Jennings (the President, Dick Allen was sick)

The Southern Tier Radio Control Association (STRCA) is an association of RC clubs in Endicott, Ithaca and Sayre. All club fields are within a one hour drive from each other. The association was formed in 1966 with the basic goal of getting members from each of the clubs to enter into competition. The original meets consisted of fun fly events. A racing event has been run the past two years and this year a pattern event is being added. Points are awarded to each individual and to each club for participation and performance. The point scoring has been set up such that the individual and his club earn more points for his participation in an event than for his performance in that event. A club championship and individual trophies to tenth place are awarded at a dinner held in November. Cost of the trophies is covered by a one dollar entry fee at each meet.

In the past history of the association, the Aeroguidance Society has never won the club championship. All that is needed to win the championship is to get everyone out to participate in the events. 1971

STRCA Events:

June 27 – 1:00 PM – Pattern Contest at our field. Mufflers required.

July 18 – 1:00 PM – Fun Fly events at Sayre, PA. Mufflers required

DATE NOT YET SET – Ithaca Races. Mufflers not required.

Three racing classes by engine size:

Class I – 0 - .30

Class II - .31 - .46

Class III - .47 - .61

The airplane must meet wing area versus engine size regulations called out in AMA Sport Pylon Provisional Rules. Any airplane other than a kit must have a 15% airfoil.

So far this year the AGS has participated in three flying demonstrations. On May 22 we assisted the MOB at Chenango Bridge, on May 31 we thrilled thousands at Broome County airport, and on June 4, several of the club members flew demonstration for the IBM Amateur Radio Club.

But that's not all! We have been asked by IBM to participate in their country club demonstrations on June 26. A few of our members met with country club officials to work out the details, particularly the location for our flying demonstration. The present plans call for our part of the day long festivities to begin at 2:30 and last for about ½ to ¾ hour. We will fly from either the No. 1 or No. 10 fairway of the country club golf course which will put us right in the middle of the action. Safety is, of course, one of our major concerns and we have been promised adequate spectator control. There are even plans to stop the golfing during part of the show, how about that!
