AGS General Membership Meeting – Jesse

The AGS General Meeting was held on 11/1/2021 at the Tri-Cities Airport in Endicott, NY. The meeting was called to order at 6:35 P.M with 12 members in attendance and no guests.

1) Treasury Report

 Bob Jennings gave a financial earning report on the current standings of the Club's income, expenses, and account balance.

2) Secretary Position

 The Secretary position remains to be vacant. Currently Jesse Pagels is holding two positions: the Vice Presidency and the Secretary. Anyone interested in taking on the position should reach out to the Board for further information.

3) Holiday Party

- The question was raised as to whether or not AGS should host a holiday party. Meeting attendees were ambivalent.
- If a holiday party is to be held, the opinion was voiced that lumber sale proceeds should not be used.
- The subject was tabled for the next General Meeting (December).

4) Use of Club Funds in Light of the Recent Lumber Sale

 A suggestion was made that club members should submit detailed plans with cost estimates for AGS-related improvements. Suggestions would then be later reviewed by the Board of Directors during BOD meetings.

- A discussion about the removal of the tree line (primarily the tree to the east) was raised. Further discussion is required.
- Solar panels: Some have promoted the idea of installing solar panels along with batteries, etc., for charging batteries.
 - An alternative (and cheaper) solution would be to buy a gas generator to be stored in the shed and used whenever required.
- Outreach: Some funds could be used for outreach and hopefully help grow the club's membership. Further discussion is encouraged.

5) Field Winterization

- The field has been winterized
- It was noted that the Zero-turn mower has a problem clearing the grass and thereby leaving clumps of clippings on the runways and other mowed areas. Suggestions for fixing the problem are more than welcome.
- The portion of the road that was washed out remains to be secured and could worsen over time if left unchecked.
 - Suggested that Double Aught Lumber help has they will need to secure the road for their logging trucks in the near future.

6) Request for an Audit of the Last Five Years of the Club's Budget

• There is a wish to get a better understanding of how the club has been budgeting it's expenses in comparison to actual outflows.

7) The meeting was adjourned at 7:04 P.M.

THE PREZ SEZ – Dick Allen

It sure was great to get back to a club meeting and also see such a fine turnout for our ever-popular auction. There were several comments that we should have a spring, as well as fall, auction. What do you think?

Our Field Chairman, Ralph Jackson, informed me that the benches and mowers have been stowed away for the winter. Also, please remember not to drive up the road to the field when it is so soft that deep ruts or other damage would result.

HELPFUL HINTS – Bob Noll

Here are some building tips I thought most everyone would like to know about. Many times, it's the little things we accept as routine which turn out to be most helpful to the other guy. Let me know your favorite gimmick or building trick.

- Polyester and epoxy resins don't mix. When gluing anything to a fiberglass fuselage don't use epoxy glue. Mostly all fiberglass fuselages are made with polyester resin and epoxy will not stick to it properly. Use polyester resin to attach motor mounts, firewalls and servo mounts.
- An easy way to cut wheel wells in foam wing cores is to find a tin can of proper size and remove the flange around the top. Rotate can back and forth while applying pressure.

- Why not tint the canopy on your next plane. Use any clothing dye and adjust the darkness of tint by controlling the time the canopy is in the dye solution. If the canopy has a salvage edge around the bottom, leave it on to retain the shape of the canopy when it is in the hot solution. Be sure to use a container with enough room to immerse the entire canopy without bending it since the bend will not come out.
- When cutting foam wings, be sure and angle the toothpicks used to hold the templates toward the center of the core. The reason is so that the hot wire will not snag a toothpick and ruin your core.
- To keep fuel tubing in your clunk tank from folding over and restricting the fuel supply, replace some of the tubing with some copper tubing. Only enough flexible fuel tubing needs to be used to connect the copper to the outlet tube and to the clunk.
- Automotive lacquer putty is great for filling pin holes in fiberglass fuselages or cowls.
- Try some vinyl latex bas spackling compound for filling nicks and gouges in balsa before covering. It can be purchased at most hardware stores, is easy to apply, sands extremely well and is water soluble.
- If you've got a lot of dirt and varnish buildup on your engine, get some Sunbeam Metal Kleen.
 Available at Burt's appliance department in Endicott, it will really do a job and remove that dirty black crud.

The Trouble with Trees – by Scott Wallace

At the October club meeting some suggestions for field improvements were discussed. One idea was to clear a large swath of trees along one of the runway approaches, the Board even had a quote for a sizable amount of money to do that. I trust the BoD will do the right thing in regards to protecting our treasury but do have an observation based on 50+ years in RC and the past 22 as an AGS member.

Trees don't kill model airplanes, pilots do! In the past few years, I've seen more AGS models in trees than in the past 20. The tree line isn't the issue as there's really no point considering the models most of us fly to be flying low, slow approaches near the trees. Almost everything flown at our field, whether made of balsa or foam, is lightly loaded and can slow down very nicely for a landing without putting the model at risk by flying low over trees. Now you may ask, "hey Scott...didn't *you* put a model in the trees this year?" I sure did, but it wasn't the tree's fault! I was flying a new model and was distracted by another flier doing touch and goes in front of me, I took my eyes off my model for a second and that's all it took. Lesson learned but not the field or tree's fault at all.

If you find landings at AGS are a challenge and get tense when it's time to land, I would be happy to work with you some evening or weekend, and I'm sure most of the experienced members would be willing as well. A few simple practice approaches with an observer would help ease the nerves going forward. There's really no reason to ever be out low, over trees and find yourself out of battery or out of fuel either – always fly high enough to where you can make the runway "dead stick".

Royal Coachman - by Scott Wallace

Here is the finished Royal Coachman I showed framed up in last month's Connector. A simple, all sheet balsa airplane that can be built quickly and inexpensively. This design would make for a simple electric conversion and possibly even a model to reuse that motor, ESC and batteries from a crash damaged foam plane. Would be great if a few AGS members could tackle building one of these over the winter months, this project would be an ideal first balsa build.
