Show & Tell



VIRUS: This is my third Virus. I still have my original plans from 1963. The Virus is a scratch building project. There never was a kitted version of Ken Willard's Virus. I built this Virus for my flying buddy, Paul Mathis. I wanted to have a Virus in a different location so someone else could have the fun I've been having introducing R/C pilots to RUDDER ONLY flying. With a modern servo and an electric motor for power flying a rudder only airplane is a pleasure. Watching the fun R/C pilots (Some highly skilled, like our editor, Todd) were having at VR/CS reunions mastering rudder only was why I wanted to make one for Paul. Back in 1963 he and I were trying to master R/C flight with my original Virus which was powered by a Cos .049 Baby Bee and controlled by a Babcock escapement.

DR I: Don't laugh! Although this is a display model, there are more pieces in the top wing than in the entire Virus! It took a week to build with an hour or two most days.

Winter Build Updates: by Scott Wallace

Had planned to have this 1980's Great Planes Trainer Sixty, built from a balsa workbench short kit, finished in February but the weather hasn't cooperated. Needs a clear coat and then final assembly, original plan was to use monokote but decided to use up the covering and paint I had leftover.

The Great Planes Trainer Sixty (and Trainer Forty) kits were updates of the original 1970s' Bridi RCM Trainer and RCM Trainer Jr. In my opinion the "improvements" were outweighed by the negatives so I've obtained short kits of the original versions in both 40 & 60 sizes and they're on my build list for next winter, these are among the best all-around models ever designed. They have a thick, fully symmetrical airfoils and will do any aerobatic maneuver you can throw at them but are also rock steady at slow speeds.
