#### **AGS General Meeting Minutes - by Tom Fargo.**

#### **Aeroguidance Society Meeting #902**

In attendance: Ed Bennett, Dave Dewey-Wright, Tom Fargo, Charlie Hatton, Jeff Hatton, Bob Jennings, Todd Kopl, Bob Noll, Ray Phillips, Kieran Sweeney, Dave Smith, Scott Wallace, Brent Bryson

Meeting called to order at 6:35 P.M.

July 2023 meeting minutes accepted.

*Treasurer's report:* Presented and read by Bob J. Motion passed to accept Treasurer's report.

Current Budget: Dave D. discussed the AGS current budget. Some important considerations were discussed by members such as, how the ongoing FAA FRIA approvals or denials for RC club flying sights might impact our local area and affect future club memberships. Income from the logging company was also brought up to date and welcomed, especially in considering future membership dues and working toward and maintaining a balanced budget. A motion was approved to accept the budget. \*Ray suggested that next year, he would like to see the budget presented as "actuals".

Land plane: Members discussed the purchase of a new or used land plane to maintain the access road in the future. Dave D. stopped at Central Tractor to see the one they had listed at \$1,599. Dave asked them about shipping and when they checked, the land plane showed up with a price of \$1,099 on layaway. Tom F. asked Dave D. if he had purchased the land plane, but Dave said no, that he was going back the next day to do so.

*New Board Members:* Dave D. asked the group if there were volunteers for any of the upcoming board members positions. He also asked members to consider choices for upcoming elections and term limits. Kieran S. volunteered to take over the

position of Treasurer without objections. Jeff H. volunteered to stay on as VP for one more year. Dave D. asked Tom F. about remaining as secretary and without any other volunteers; he agreed to fulfill the position for the upcoming year. Dave D. reminded members that his position as President also needs to be filled because his term will be up. Dave D. said he is also going to check into putting together a nominating committee.

*New/Old Business:* Ray P. asked if the club was still interested in using the pilot's club house at Tri-Cities airport this coming season/winter for AGS monthly meetings. Ray also said we have one month to make a decision on what to offer if we use the facility.

Upcoming events: The upcoming AGS pattern contest will be on Saturday, August 19, 2023. Jeff H. asked for possible volunteers for the event to either help or fly in. Scott W. asked Jeff H. if he was getting the port-a-john serviced before the pattern event. Jeff H. confirmed he will be applying to the AMA for the pattern sanction event after Ray P. asked about the status.

The upcoming AGS VRCS – Spirit of Selinsgrove event will be on Saturday, September 2, 2023. Scott W. talked about the event that he and Ray will be hosting and the many different types of planes that will be flying. He also encouraged any members that were interested in balsa wood models to either stop out to the event to see all the pilots and planes, or to fly in, or help with the event itself.

**Special Thanks:** Todd K. thanked Ray P. for replacing the fan guard on the zero-turn mower!!!!!

**Presentations:** Brent B. brought a 3D printed Hawker Hurricane by 3D LabPrint.

Jeff H. brought a portable battery pod about the size of a car battery which can charge multiple RC batteries.

Dave D. brought a couple of small planes 1) Cap 232 and 2) A10 Warthog to give away.

Kieran S. brought two examples of 3D parts that he printed using filament from two different 3D companies; one is Overture and the other is Polylite LWPLA, while also pointing out differences in weight and rigidity. Kieran can also print out pilots for anyone that might be interested.

Motion to adjourn and agreed upon at 8:08 P.M.


