Meeting called to order at 6:38 P.M.

August 2023 meeting minutes accepted.

August Board meeting minutes read by Dave D.

Treasurer's report: Presented and read by Bob J with no questions or comments.

Slate of Board Candidates: Dave D. presented the slate of board candidates for the next meeting as follows:

VRCS Event: The Vintage Radio Control Society Event was held at the field on Sept. 2, 2023. Ray P. said the weather cooperated and we had a good turn out with several pilots and their planes. Three items were raffled off and a pattern contest was held in the afternoon.

Pattern Contest Event: Jeff H. said that despite the strong wind we enjoyed another successful pattern contest. Bob Noll commented about having the same number of entries for both events.

Old Business: Dave D. talked about the land plane purchase and that it should be available soon, but mentioned that the board should have brought the proposal to the club for a full vote and he said that the board will look into a possible update to the by-laws to avoid the concern that arose during the process. Ray P. asked if Dave D. could check with the logging company to have them deliver stone to spread on our access road as an option before having to make a decision to purchase.

New Business: Ray P. discussed possible remote ID relief coming by the 9/16 date that the FAA has listed for the enactment of the Remote ID law. He presented an update on the status of FRIA and Remote ID implementation by FAA and talked about the AMA requesting and event wavier process.

Charlie H. showed the small Remote ID (looked like a large computer chip) that he had purchased for his drone for \$50. He said he is waiting for the connector that he also ordered, to plug directly to the drone.

Bill Green proposed for the club to purchase a lift in order to work on the 0-turn tractor. Dave D. presented a motion to spend up to \$400 from the capital expense account for the lift which was unanimously approved.

Ray P asked about getting the distribution list fixed. Jeff H. has been having trouble contacting the gentleman who handles the club email server and he is investigating options.

Upcoming events: Harold Peeling discussed a visitor night he is planning for 9/28 to bring several co-workers to experience their first taste of RC flying with the help of experience pilots at around 4pm. It should be a fun evening!

The 34th Annual VRCS Spirit of Selinsgrove Celebration was held Sep 2, 2023 at the Aeroguidance Society field in Endicott, NY. A huge thank you to all the fliers and modelers that came out to support the event.
