

The last project of the day was the repair of the leak in the pond and installation of the new pipe to centrol the water level. The cost of the repair for cement, pipe etc. was a donation from your Prez. The pond is now fixed and the water level is up 2 1/2 ft. The water is clearing up nicely.

The day ended with a non-demonstration flight of Bob Noll's Quickie 500, as he turned the transmitter switch on before he left home in an attempt to be ready to fly.

This month Dennis Seely tuned up the club tractor. Cost of parts, \$20, was donated to the club by Wayne Sitler. Dennis also donated and delivered a gas stove for the pavilion and is responsible for making and installing the AGS sign at the entrance gate.
