

STRC Pylon Races #5 and #6

On July 8th, we held our fifth STRC pylon race. Unfortunately for me, it was a night I won't ever forget. Anything and everything went wrong with the McDonalds racer. But with the help of Art Riegal, Bob Noll and Frank Gioffredo, I was ready for my first racing heat. Just as Frank let go of the plane, the rudder fell off due to a very poor glue joint. Just minutes before, I was flying some practice laps. I'm just thankful that the rudder didn't fall off during that time. To make matters worse, Jerry Roscoe and the John Deere racer were having radio interference problems so he was forced out of racing for the night. Regardless of these minor incidences, the racing between Bob Noll's Viagara racer, Jim Quinn's STP racer, Art Riegal's Jeff Gordon racer and Terry Terrenoire's Tide racer was extremely tight. In the end Bob and Art tied with 8 points, Terry and Jim tied with 7 points, Frank captured 5 points, Jerry received 1 point, and I got a big goose egg.

On August 5th, we held our 6th STRC pylon race. Even though the weather looked rough, we had a great night of flying. My thanks to those helpers who came out to give us a hand. We were quite understaffed for this race, some guys pulled double duty, but by the end of the night, we had all of our heats completed. Prior to starting the races, Art sat down with me and explained how to properly set up the races to ensure that they were more equally balanced. This way, an extremely good pilot can't always race newer pilots and easily take first place. It took a while to figure out, but in the end, the races were much more exciting. Jim Quinn's STP racer, Terry Terrenoire's Tide racer and Bob Noll's Viagara racer were all running guick. Frank and I tried to catch them with the Budweiser and McDonald's racers, but in the end we were better off flying a straight course and hoping that the others would cut a corner and lose a lap. Must be beer and grease are no competition for well oiled, clean, stiff racers. At the end of the night, Bob received 9 points, Terry and Art each received 7 points, I received 6 points (and I kicked Frank's butt...), Jim received 5 points and Frank received 3 points. I'll have the season point standings at the next meeting.

AGS'er at the Precision Aerobatics Nats. by Bob Noll

This was the first year that I flew in the competition at this fine facility. I now have seen the Nats operation from both sides and it is great to meet friends from all around the country, no matter what side of the flight line you are on.

AGS Member Heads Special Children's Activity by Bob Noll

I was invited to take pictures at the closing session of an Airplane Appreciation Activity held recently at the St. James School in JC. Steven Bard, assisted by past AGS members Charlie Tarricone and Myron Cary, have been devoting much of their time teaching model aviation to 9 thru 12 years olds at the Endicott Boys and Girls Club as well as at several schools in our area.

It was a delightful experience seeing these young people's excitement when the planes they worked on for several hours took to the air. Both boys and girls build the original design rubber powered planes from stick and tissue. Plans are available at JG's.

The course consists of four sessions. First, they put the sticks together using white glue. Steven says he uses the white glue rather than CA glue because it is harmless and makes the children understand the importance of patience. "No instant gratification here", said Steven!

The covering goes on during the second session. Again, white glue is used and in the third session the dihedral is placed in the wing and the stab is glued to the fuselage. At the fourth session the students are taught how to find the CG and glue the wing in place. The fourth session finishes with the first flight on the planes. The expression of satisfaction on all of the children's faces is worth a million bucks as they witness the results of their work and patience.

My hat is off to Steven, Charlie and Myron for their effort to help our young people appreciate the worthwhile endeavor of model aviation.
