Model Aviation Day 2007 Scott Wallace

We are fast approaching our marquis event for 2007, Model Aviation Day. The event is to be held at our club field on July 21, from 10-4 PM.

I have approximately 18 volunteers lined up, but certainly every club member is welcome (and encouraged) to come out. We're not planning to work anyone all day, so come out, help a while, and enjoy the day! Even if you really cannot help "work" the event please come out and bring a model or two for static display, and if you would like to help with demo flights I'm sure we can use all the fliers we can muster.

The basic event will consist of greeting and welcoming visitors, giving a brief tour of our flying site and getting folks into a "ground school" and have them spend a few minutes on a flight simulator. From there they are welcome to fly as much as possible on our 3 club trainers with buddy boxes. Younger kids will be able to build and fly Delta Dart rubber powered models, I'm planning two building sessions for these models.

Throughout the day we'll do demo flights with sport planes, pattern models, mock racing, warbirds, electrics of all types, heli's...the full spectrum of the hobby.

A FREE picnic lunch will be served to all our guests (and helping club members), and it will cost the club nothing as both Lockheed Martin and BAE Systems have contributed \$300 each for our event. Additionally, this event is co-sponsored by the AMA which has donated 2 complete RTF trainer model setups along with Flight Simulator software, all because the AGS was a winner in the AMA's Take Off and Grow (TAG) program.

We enjoy a great contestant following due to our reputation for running a quality event.

I have included a list of assignments and I ask that the chairmen be sure to contact each of their teams in order to provide specific details and organize their shifts. We could use a few more scribes to ease the workload. Please consider this front row job with the best seat in the house by agreeing to record scores presented by the judges.

There is one important thing that I need to emphasize. *The contest goes on in spite of bad weather so please be sure you are there to do your job even if the weather doesn't look flyable.* Our contestants come from great distances and we must be ready for them. Flying starts at 9 AM Saturday and continues until about 6 PM. On Sunday we start at 9 AM and finish up around 3 PM. We have a reputation for starting our opening ceremonies on time and so if you are working the early shifts, please be there at 8:30 AM each day.

Many club members and contestants will be camping for the weekend at the airport. This is very convenient and a lot of fun; you may want to consider this if you have a tent, camper or motor home. Port-A-Johns will be available, but there will be no hookups.

Also it was pointed out that we are not to cut a direct path between the upper and lower pavilions.

By-laws changes

Motion to vote (all up/all down) Doug Breneman, Second by Art Riegal.

Article III.G. and Article XVI.C, which defines an active member status and the ability of the board to remove a member, brought about a lot of discussion. The discussion centered on the board's ability to remove purely social members, elderly members and others that at times may be unable to fulfill the active member definition now can be removed by board. Terry Terrenoire stated that it was not intended to vote out long time members who have contributed to the club. Bill Markovitz stated that members should be voting out membership, Bob Noll read Article XVI E, the procedure for general membership re-instatement. Doug Breneman stated that this was extracted from other clubs by-laws and procedures. Terry Terrenoire stated that nothing says that this is mandatory, but a board option to remove. Discussion continued for a while and then was closed by Terry. The motion was then brought up for a vote. Final vote 15 for, 6 against. Motion passed with a 2/3 majority. Updated by-laws to be placed on the Club's website.
