FAA's Registration Requirement for UAS

We are writing to update you on the FAA's registration requirement. Today, Congress finalized legislation that will **reverse** the earlier court ruling in the John Taylor case and restore the FAA's UAS registration requirement, including for AMA members.

We expect this legislation – the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2018 – to go through final passage in the House and Senate, and to the President's desk, soon. We ask all AMA members to please comply with the registration rule once it is in effect again. We will update you when this happens.

While we have always said registration makes sense at some level, we have pushed for a more reasonable threshold and argued that if registration is to be implemented, the criteria, threshold and implementation should go through rulemaking.

We continue to work closely with Congress, the FAA and other stakeholders to determine the best path forward now that UAS registration will be reinstituted. This process will take time but, as always, we are doing everything we can to advocate for our members and protect the model aircraft hobby.

Indoor Report – by Scott Wallace

Unfortunately nothing to report, the second November session in Sayre was a scratch as the Sayre schools were still closed on 11/28 for the Thanksgiving break. Oh well next session coming up on Dec 12th. I needed a new indoor model like I needed a hole in the head but behold my new Twisted Hobbies Superlight series "Crack Laser" in patriotic colors:



This new generation superlight model is a bit lighter (and more fragile) than the first gen such as my SU-29 and the Crack Yak.

Speaking of indoor RC flying, its popular these days and very much taken for granted with plug and play fully aerobatic foam models weighing 5-6 ounces at most.

Did you know that over **50** years ago the AGS held one of the very first indoor RC flying sessions in the USA? My recollections are vague as I was very young then but I've confirmed with Bob Noll that at least what I recall is accurate. Back in the mid-1960's a group of inventive AGS members held an indoor RC flying day at the IBM Country Club gymnasium.

There were no off the shelf micro radio components, no micro electric motors, no Li-Po batteries, no lightweight foam airframes...no these were all hand built masterpieces.

The models were incredibly delicate, indoor Free Flight style airplanes, covered in microfilm (a liquid was poured into a container of water, where it formed an almost invisible film on the surface which was carefully lifted and applied to the delicate framework.

Believe it or not the models were rubber band powered as micro size electric motors and Li-Po batteries were many years down the road. For RC equipment nothing was available commercially so intricate, tiny single channel radio gear was designed and built by some of our very own AGS members.

At best the models made a few slow circles around the gym before the rubber motor unwound, but for 1966 this was as high tech as there was! I recall an article was published in Model Airplane News about the club's accomplishment. I will do some research through the AMA archives and try to locate that issue.
