Date: May 7, 2018

6:45pm

The minutes of the last general meeting were approved as published in The Connector.

Brent Bryson gave the financial report to those in attendance. If any member has any questions regarding our account, they can contact Brent Bryson for additional information.

President Allabaugh gave a summary of the April Board of Director's Meeting. A couple of important items:

- 1) The AMA Club Charter has been received
- 2) The AMA Gold Leader Club renewal paperwork has been submitted
 - a. BoD considering an event with the Scouts or similar to promote model aviation to the community, a requirement for maintaining Gold Leader status
- 3) Asset list updates in process

Committee Reports:

- Membership Dave Smith was voted in last month and is now a full member of the AGS
- Field AGS Field Opening went off without a hitch, was well attended and many members also enjoyed some flying time. Ray Phillips and Bill Green provided instruction on the new zero-turn mower.
- 3) Flight School Bob Noll indicated flight training will be held every Wednesday starting at 6PM (weather permitting) at the field, first session is Wed May 9. If you're interested in Flight School this year, please contact Bob.
- 4) Pylon Racing Bob Noll advised that racing returns to the AGS field again this year, starting May 8th. See the race schedule in the Connector calendar. Bob could always use more helpers, if interested come up to a race or contact Bob. Reminder, free food is provided to the helpers following every race.

- 5) Family Picnic Bob Noll gave us an early reminder regarding the family picnic, date is July 17 with July 18th as the rain date. Club will provide the main course; attendees should bring a dish to pass. Musical entertainment is lining up as well, more details to come.
- 6) Classic Pattern contest Bob Noll gave an update for the Classic Pattern contest which is planned for July 21. If interested contact Bob for maneuver schedules or more information.
- 7) Hill Top Challenge Jim Monaco advised that the date of the 2nd Annual Hilltop Challenge has been moved to Sept 8th. Jim will be emailing additional information, and Jim requests club members let him know if they plan to participate.

Old Business:

- Ray Phillips has retrieved and overhauled the cub chainsaw, it is ready for use, stored in the upper pavilion
- 2) Our new zero-turn mower is in the upper pavilion and ready for use. Please get trained by either Ray Phillips or Bill Green before using for the first time. This is a significant investment for the club and will serve us for many years if we take care of it.
- 3) The old Exmark mower sold at the auction held in Whitney Point. After commission, the club will receive an astonishing \$765. A huge THANK YOU to Wayne Kunsman and all the club members that helped make this happen.

New Business:

- 1) Neil Hunt indicated his son has qualified for the USA Aerobatics team and will compete in the next F3A World Championships.
- Update since BoD meeting AGS has been approved again as an AMA Gold Leader Club
- 3) Bill Green will be adding a chain and combination padlock (same combination as the other locks) to provide additional security for the zero-turn.

Program:

Jim Monaco gave a presentation on scratch building foam aircraft. Jim described and showed slides illustrating techniques he's developed for cutting wings and fuselages from pink foam. Jim also displayed many of the tools he uses to cut and carve the foam to shape.

One neat thing is that Jim's models are all his own original designs. His newest design pattern model was displayed and it's a very attractive aircraft. The AGS thanks Jim for presenting this good information.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.

I tightened the long screw but without the locking nut the muffler opened up again early in my 2nd heat. I withdrew at this point and took home big fat "zero" for the evening.

Tuesday evenings are flight school evenings and anyone can attend who would like to get some help. I have been a proponent of longer sticks with heavier spring pressure on your transmitters for years. I learned this from the "pros" during my pattern competition. Bret Bryson told me the he discovered how to extend the sticks on his Spectrum transmitter by using a small allen wrench and loosening the screw in the end of each stick. After loosening the screw the stick can be turned counterclockwise to lengthen the stick. Don't forget to re-tighten the screw.
