Date: Jan 7, 2018

President Rick Allabaugh called the meeting to order at 6:30

The minutes of the last general meeting were approved as published in The Connector.

Brent Bryson gave the financial report to those in attendance. If any member has any questions regarding our account, they can contact Brent Bryson for additional information.

President Allabaugh indicated the next Board of Director's Meeting will be Wed Jan 9 at 6:30PM at Delta Engineers, Architects, & Land Surveyors.

#### **Committee Reports:**

##### **Activities:**

The Mid-Winter Fly is scheduled for Feb 9 from 11AM-2PM at the BC United Soccer facility in West Corners. Neil Hunt is running the event and indicates his wife's excellent Pasta Fagioli soup will once again be available.

Date is not yet confirmed for the March Spring Fly – stay tuned.

##### **Old Business:**

Rick Allabaugh mentioned a Tony Stillman article regarding what makes for an energized club membership. Refer to this month's Prez Sez column for more information.

##### **New Business:**

On behalf of the VRCS, Ray Phillips and Scott Wallace presented Bob Noll with an engraved plaque honoring Bob for his service and dedication to the AGS, VRCS and the VRCS Spirit of Selinsgrove event. Bob has hosted the Spirit of Selinsgrove for the past 29 years and has stepped down after the 2018 event. Ray and Scott are keeping the event at the AGS field going forward.

Rick Allabaugh showed the AGS's book "Fifty Years and Still Flying" that was put together in 2005 to

celebrate the clubs 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Copies are believed to still be available from Jim Quinn if you're interested.

Bob Noll spoke about info he received from the AMA as a Leader Member. Highlights are that the AMA offers many programs that benefit the membership but are perhaps not well known. These include such programs as Takeoff and Grow (TAG), College Scholarships, Youth Leadership awards and flying site improvement grants.

Tony Jensen spoke about some of these programs and mentioned that District grant money goes unclaimed every year and is returned to AMA. It is to our benefit to get involved and check into programs that can aid the club. Tony also spoke about the qualification needed to become an AMA Leader Member and the application process.

Tony also spoke briefly regarding the new FAA requirements coming our way, the situation is still fluid as the FAA still needs to write the regulations and then implement them.

##### **Show and Tell:**

None, however some items from Don Green and Dave Lewis were made available to any takers.

##### **Program:**

Bob Noll presented an excellent program on the Tournament of Champions. Bob provided a summary of the event's history with numerous photos to help tell the story. The AGS had several connections to the TOC over the years.

Bob served as a TOC judge several times in the 1990's and relayed his experiences and impressions.

It was quite interesting to see how the TOC evolved from a pure pattern meet to larger semi-scale aerobatic models and on to giant 40% scale aerobatic models performing both precision aerobatics and 3-D type freestyle events.

The TOC events ended following the passing of Casino mogul, avid modeler and TOC sponsor William G. (Bill) Bennett.

## Proposed By-Laws Changes

The Board of Directors recommends the following By-Laws changes, proposed changes are in red.

### Article III - MEMBERSHIP

- A. Regular and Associate Members - All Regular Members shall be actively interested in radio-controlled aircraft. They must be AMA members and FCC Licensed if required. All members are expected to fulfill their obligations to the corporation such as committee assignments and assessments. All members shall agree to abide by the AGS by-laws; the AGS field rules, the by-laws of the AMA, ~~and~~ the AMA national model aircraft safety code, **applicable FAA regulations governing model aircraft, and applicable local ordinances.** All members have full rights and privileges of AGS membership. Only adults and senior members have voting rights.

### Article VIII - COMMITTEES

- A. Unless otherwise indicated in this Article, committees of the AGS shall be appointed by the President and their term of office shall be for a period of one year (unless terminated by the action of the President). The roles and responsibilities of each committee shall be defined and documented by the President and shall be published on the club website in the Members Only section. The **required** committees shall be:
1. **Field**
  2. **Membership**
  3. **Newsletter Editor**
  4. **Safety Officer (Mandatory per AMA)**

**The following committees are optional and can be filled if an AGS member volunteers to head a given committee:**

1. **Activities**
2. **Contest**
3. **Historian**
4. **Librarian**
5. **Program**
6. **Public Relations**

~~C. A nominating committee consisting of three (3) members shall be appointed at least six (6) weeks prior to the Annual Meeting. At least one (1) candidate for each office shall be recommended.~~

**C. The AGS Board of Directors is responsible to recommend a candidate or candidates for each open office position prior to the annual meeting.**

### Article XII – DISSOLUTION OF THE ORGANIZATION

- B. Upon dissolution, the AGS assets in excess of liabilities will be donated to ~~the Academy of Model Aeronautics, Inc. or to such to an~~ organization with purposes similar to the purposes of this Corporation **or a local charitable organization**, as the Board shall determine **and approved by membership vote.**

### Article XVI: RESIGNATION, TERMINATION, DISCIPLINARY ACTION, EXPULSION AND REINSTATEMENT OF MEMBERSHIP

- D. This section provides for enforcement of the Safety Rules that are related to flying activities. Any other unacceptable behavior by an individual member or members, as defined by the Board of Directors, becomes the responsibility of the Board of Directors. Any individual may be expelled from membership from the AGS by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors if, in the Board of Directors' determination, such individual willfully commits any act or omission which is a violation

of any of the terms of these Articles of Incorporation and By-laws, **or applicable FAA regulations governing model aircraft**, or the Rules of the AMA, or which is detrimental to the AGS, the AMA, or model aviation.

## **Article XVII: GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE (FLIGHT AND GROUND SAFETY RULES)**

### A. Purpose

The grievance procedure provides a mechanism to enforce existing safety rules by providing a progressive disciplinary system when needed. Although most complaints can be resolved informally, if a complaint is serious or cannot be resolved informally, the matter should be referred to the Safety Committee for its consideration by means of a Grievance Form to be filled out and turned into the Safety Committee Chairman (**Safety Officer**). At least one witness is required to sign the Grievance Form.

### B. Safety Committee

**The Safety Committee shall consist of the Safety Officer, President and Vice-President.** The Safety Committee (hereafter called the Committee) shall use its judgment in carrying out action on the following:

1. A grievance form will be filled out and turned into the Committee Chairman. At least one witness is required.
2. FIRST VIOLATION
  - a. Viewpoints of both complainants and accused will be considered.
  - b. Complainant's name will be disclosed.
  - c. If the Committee so decides, a verbal reprimand will be given to the accused by the

Committee and this will be recorded in the Committee files.

### 3. SECOND VIOLATION

- a. Complainant's name will be disclosed.
- b. The accused has the right to a written rebuttal, to be reviewed by the Committee.
- c. If the Committee so decides, the flying privileges of the accused will be suspended for thirty (30) days. Written notice of this action shall be issued and a copy of the notice published in the AGS newsletter. This action will be recorded in the Committee files.

### 4. THIRD VIOLATION

- a. Complainant's name will be disclosed.
- b. If the Committee so decides, the **full** Board of Directors will vote on the expulsion of the accused at the next board meeting. Written notice of this action will be sent to the accused and a copy of the notice published in the AGS newsletter prior to the next board meeting.

## **Recognizing Bob Noll – submitted by Ray Phillips**

During the Jan. 2019 Aeroguidance Society's club meeting, Scott Wallace and Ray Phillips presented Bob Noll with a plaque of recognition for his years of dedicated service to radio control model aviation. This plaque recognizes Bob's contribution to the Vintage Radio Control Society (VRCS), Spirit of Selinsgrove Event (SOS) and the Aeroguidance Society (AGS) of Endicott, NY.

Bob became a member of AGS in 1959. During his years of continuing service to AGS he has been CD for over 40 events. Bob and his family were always there to help during club construction projects at the AGS field. Bob participated in the annual Mall Shows to introduce new people to the radio control model airplane hobby. Over the years Bob built many RC aircraft and was an avid competitor in AMA pattern contests.

In 1989 Bob hosted the first Spirit of Selinsgrove VRCS event. He worked tirelessly as CD for this event for 29 consecutive years. Under Bob's leadership this event has become one of VRCS premier events with attendance of hobbyist from the North East and Canada. Bob announced his retirement from SOS in 2018.

Bob served as president of VRCS from 2001-20017. During these years the VRCS membership increased and we saw an expansion in the numbers of VRCS events dedicated to the living history of flying radio control airplanes. Bob continues to write articles for Model Aviation about the history and technical developments in our hobby. With availability of modern RC equipment and systems, it is always fun to look back from where we came. Bob has stated many times, "We did it that way because that is all we had".

This plaque is just a small token of appreciation of Bob's contribution to the community of radio control airplane modelers.
