RIP Monokote – in the mid 1960's Top Flite introduced Monokote to RC community, followed a few years later by Super Monokote. It became the gold standard for modelers in that it provided a quick, durable, goodlooking means to finish a model airplane. Over the years many colors were offered and each year new ones were added. That all ended with the Hobbico/Tower Hobbies collapse a few years ago when they were acquired by

Horizon Hobby. Horizon markets a competitor, Ultracote, which although easier to apply isn't as durable. Coupled with low-cost competition, generically referred to as Chinacote, and the fact less balsa builders are out there compared to 20 years ago Horizon has discontinued Super Monokote. It will be missed.

(Editor's note: I have used Monokote since the early 80's. The most recent rolls I purchased from Tower did not have the same characteristics as my older stock from the 90's/early 2000's...so something had already changed in recent years in my opinion). Scott also informed me that Tru-Turn Spinners is also suspending manufacture of model products as-of April 2022...these were simply the best in my opinion going back to 1985)

My building pace has slowed, I've been spending time going through existing models to ensure they are ready for the upcoming flying season. I did focus on the RCM Trainer Jr and have it within a few hours of being ready to cover.




With the 2022 flying season kicking off I want to highlight a few of pages available on the AGS website http://www.agsny.org that might come in handy. For new or prospective members the Club Information tab a good starting point. In addition to information on the AGS, AMA and FAA details can be found including the TRUST or the FAA Drone Safety Test.



RC pilots need to know how to register their model airplanes with the FAA and keep up to date with FAA regulations. Links to get the B4UFLY app and the B4UFLY Website to check for any Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs) every time they fly.




The latest feature on the AGS website is the Field Weather page which is found in text at the bottom of the home page and under the Flying Site menu.



The weather information displayed on the page comes from the National Weather Service and is based on the latitude and longitude coordinates of the field as well as the closest observation point at Binghamton Airport. The weather data is updated at approximately 50 minutes after the hour and cached locally on the AGS server as a user accesses the page. You may experience a pause in the weather page display as the weather data is retrieved from the National Weather Service. Clicking on the "reload page button" on your web browser will not result in a new forecast until one is available from the National Weather Service. The AGS forecast is a tailored 3 day forecast that includes expected temperature and wind data. The wind data is color coded by day, a link to the Local RADAR is added and the sun positions from sunrise to sunset for a given day are plotted in a single graphical diagram (Expected Field Conditions below). The graphic shows the time of day, expected temperature, wind and sun position relative to the AGS runways. How to read a wind barb is provided on the page.

Lastly, the Field menu found on the AGS Member's Only section, provides access to the Mowing List and the Field Maintenance pages. The operator's manual for the mower can be found on the Field Maintenance page to refresh your memory on safety features and operations before you mount the noble steed.
