Build Updates: by Scott Wallace

After a busy month of painting, sanding, and masking repeated several times my RCM Trainer Jr. is in its colors. Still have the clear coats to bring out the gloss and then final assembly but the model should fly by the end of July. Will be powered by a period correct late 1970s OS 40 FSR engine.

I have flown the bigger 60 size version a lot lately and remain convinced this series of models is among the very best sport planes ever designed – far better than

the ubiquitous Ugly Sticks, 4-Stars, Super Sportsters, etc. They will do any maneuver you can throw at it, yet with its thick symmetrical airfoil will still slow down to a crawl for picture perfect landings.

Anyone wanting to try their hand at a balsa build this winter these models are easy builds and <u>balsaworkbench.com</u> has short kits for the 20, 40, and 60 sizes. Would make great electric conversions as they are light, have a hatch already designed in, and the open front end makes it easy to mount an electric motor.
